Five years Ago-2019-Pastor Michelle Grunsiech in her column wrote that our observance of Lent reminds us that we were created "from dust and we shall return to dust". She noted that the season of Lent will take us into the valley of despair and deliver us up to the glory of Easter joy. The Day Care celebrated "World Syndrome Day on March 21st. The Arev. Jane Ritterson sent a note thanking the congregation for her farewell luncheon last Sunday. She said she was grateful for the wonderful 5 1/2 years she spent in ministry with us.

Fifteen years Ago-2009-Rev. Jane Ritterson in her column spoke about Lent being a time of soul searching and reflection and for taking stock of one's life. She said

that Lent was the time to listen for God's still small voice and to hold Jesus Christ our Lord close to our hearts. Twenty years Ago-2004 - Pastor Pam Cowan in her "From the Pastor's Hat Rack Column said that Lent is a reminder of God's call to us to prepare for new things to come. Lent also is a time to make ready for how we will minister as servants of the risen Christ. Souper Bowl of Caring Sunday raise \$310 which was given to Hugh and Melissa Kronrot to help with the care of their baby daughter Sara and 246 cans of soup were given to the Chester Eastside Food Cupboard. Ashley Zebley was named to the All Del-Valley Field Hockey, First team for the second year and she also received Honorable mention to the All Delco Field Hockey Team for the second time. Mia Kim was the featured artist at Café By the Creek.

Twenty-five ago-1999vears Interim Pastor Paul Tuttle in his

column asked what each of us would be doing during Lent to improve our spiritual self as well as what we will do to further Christ's ministry through Aston Presbyterian Church. He told us to deepen our spiritual faith during Lent. At Worship on March 7th, the Aston /singers of the Gospel brought the message through а musical presentation titled "Believe" under the direction of Laura Worrell. The Rev. Mary Alice Lyman for /Swarthmore Presbyterian was the speaker at the Presbyterian Women's Lenten Breakfast.

Thirty years ago-1994-Pastor Scott Cupp's "Ex Cathedra" column wrote that Lent is a season of spiritual renewal through repentance and growth in personal faith. He also said that within our Presbytery there were 15 churches that were in danger of closing. He encouraged us to work on making our ministry at Aston Presbyterian more effective for our Lord Jesus. An All-Church Family Luncheon was held on March 20th. Sponsored by the Mariners with games for all ages. The Youth Group held their own /winter Olympics in Heibeck Hall on March 27th. The games were won by the team from Great Britain represented by Kim Henderson and Kara Czernik.





Thirty-five years ago-1989-Pastor Scott Cupp's "Ex Cathedra column", spoke about the tools he was acquiring during his doctoral studies. He asked our congregation to commit themselves to Worship and to Christ's work and witness in our communities. We were searching for a new organist due to the retirement of Olive Beiswenger, our organist, for many years. Volunteers were needed to work at the General Assembly that will be in Philadelphia from June 2nd-thru June 14th. Bill Schuler. Jr was our point person for those wishing to volunteer.

Forty years ago-1984-Pastor Bob Boell in his column spoke about not missing Worship or neglecting our times for prayer and Bible Study. He noted that Lent has traditionally been a time to renew our faith commitment to Jesu Christ our Lord. On Ash /Wednesday we held two brief Communion Services at 7:00 A.M. and 7:30 P.M. Also, a Lenten Prayer Group was meeting at &:00 A.M. all through the Lenten Season. Elder Judy McNelly was elected as the Presbytery of Philadelphia's Youth /advisory Delegate the General to Assembly this summer Phoenix. Arizona. Jim Lewis was named Athletic Director School. Chichester High Stephanie Carpenter won first in the Green Ridge Elementary Book Worm Club's reading contest by reading 22 books. The Adult Class was

concluding a series entitled "A Survey of the Bible" and will begin a new study on "The Church and /education led by Dick Hartranft and John Monaghan.

Forty-five years ago-1979-Pastor Bob Boell wrote that during the Lenten Period of 1979 we should meditate on the meaning of God's sending of HIS Son to be precious stone for our salvation. Elder William Schuler, Jr. was elected as an Elder Commissioner from Philadelphia the General Presbytery to Assembly in Kansas City. The only previous Elder Commissioner from our church was Elder William Schuler, Sr in 1965. Bob Sampson and Bob Boell will once again during Lent do the Trial of Jesus with Bob Sampson as the Prosecutor and Bob Boell as the /defense Attorney.

50 years ago-1974-Pastor Bob Boell in his column talked about Lent as a time that we should be faithful in Worship attendance, faithful in daily devotions and we should give ourselves to our Lord Jesus Christ and His kingdom. A Lenten Communion Supper was held on March 31st

As we move forward in March towards Palm Sunday, Holy Week, and the glorious celebration of Christ's rising from the dead; let us remember as the 1970's Dick Avery and Don Marsh hymn reminds us: "Every morning is Easter Morning, the past is over and gone." A new day has dawned with Christ rising from the dead so with our Risen Savior let us go forth to witness His new life and to invite new people to come and join with us in following our Lord.

Recipe of the Month: Pineapple Casserole

½ cup butter (small cubed)

Ingredients:

½ cup sugar 3 large eggs 6 slices of bread - cubed (white or honey wheat) 1 - 20oz can crushed or chunked style pineapple in juice

How to make:

Cinnamon (optional)

- Preheat oven to 350F
- Mix sugar and eggs together 2.
- Add butter and pineapple
- Add cubed bread and mix till all evenly mixed
- Pour into an 8x8 or 9x9 square pan
- Optional Sprinkle with cinnamon
- Bake at 350F for 45 minutes and golden brown (note, it will continue to set when cooling
- Serve warm or cold and Enjoy as dessert with whipped cream or ice cream or as a side dish with your Easter Ham.

Making it for a larger crowd - double the recipe use a 13x9, use both 1 can of chunked and 1 can of crushed pineapple, and use ¾ cup of sugar instead of 1 whole cup.
