Cents Ability for April - Delco Food Bank

The folks of Imago Dei Metropolitan Community Church officially kicked off the Delco Food Project ministry at St. Timothy's in 2020 with the Covid pandemic shut downs. DFP still is operating in a unique and dignified drive-thru style, packing dry goods, fresh produce and bakery items for more than 200 families a week! New members received in April 1994: Walt Beddow, Lori Clements, Karen Gordon, Barbara and Jim Morton and Betsy Wrench.





Thirty-five years Ago-1989-Pastor Scott Cupp in his "Ex Cathedra" column spoke about rumors of Doom and Gloom problems within our Church. He noted that any problems we have tom face can be corrected by staying united. The Adult Class was studying the "Power of Myth" and was being led by Dick Hartranft. The St. Thomas and Friends class was studying the Presbyterian Church USA's Book of Confessions. An all-Church Fellowship Luncheon was held for everyone on April 23rd.

Forty years ago-1984- Pastor Bob Buell in his column wrote that Jesus is alive in the world, and this is what we celebrate every Easter. On April 15th-Palm /Sunday, the choir presented the cantata "The Day He Wore My Crown". The Youth Group led at 7:00 am. Dawn Service on Easter Sunday followed by a pancake breakfast. On April 8th the first annual Spring Banquet was held. The Adult Class was in the midst of a study titled: "The Education" Church and and starting on April 29th they were beginning a study titled "The Church Looks at World Issues" with Congressman Bob Edgar as a guest speaker. In the Church Steve Bomhoff Family: attending the University of South Alabama, Stephanie /carpenter was leading her class at Green Ridge Elementary in the number of books read with 25, Ginny Carroll was inducted into the National Junior Honor Society at Northley Middle School, Jean Boell was

elected President of District I Presbyterian. On April 29th a Homecoming Event was held with many former members attending.

ago-1979-Forty-five years Pastor Bob Boell in his column spoke about Easter being a time to shout and laugh because Jesus Christ has risen from the dead. So, he noted we should laugh on Easter Morning as we celebrate His resurrection. The Presbyterian Women's Lenten Breakfast was held on April 3rd with Ruth Horotkins sharing her musical talents. As our Easter Season continues on toward Pentecost let us sing with gusto these words from Bill Gloria Gaither's Hymn: and "Because He Lives": "God sent his Son, they called him Jesus; he came to love, heal, and forgive. He lived and died to buy my pardon; an empty grave is there to prove my Savior lives, Because he lives, I can face tomorrow; because he lives all fear is gone; because I know he holds the future, and life is worth the living just because he lives."

Recipe of the Month: **Impossible Ham Pie**

Ingredients:

1 ½ cups cubed ham 1 cup shredded cheese ½ cup bisquick (pancake mix) 1 cup milk 2 eggs salt and pepper to taste

- 1. Preheat oven to 400F

Other add ins - chopped broccoli, drained and squeezed spinach, chopped onion, tomatoes, or other veggies.
